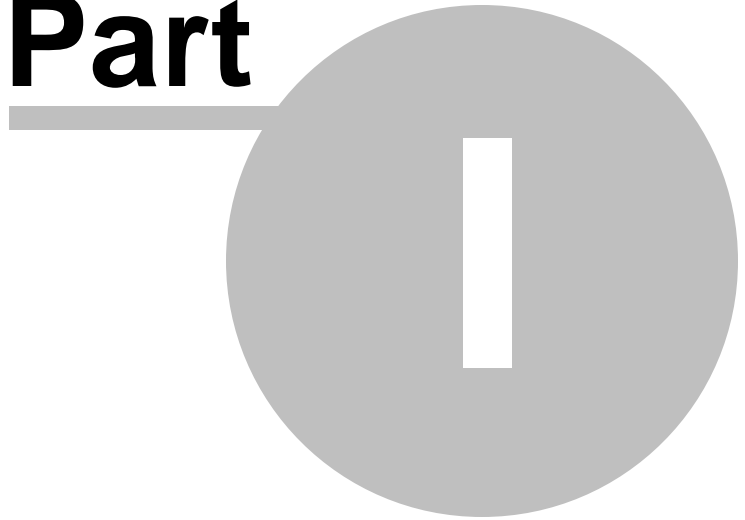

1 Introduction

PDF files are great for exchanging formatted files across platforms and between folks who don't use the same software. But sometimes we need to be able to take images or text out of a PDF file and use it in Web pages, word processing documents, PowerPoint presentations, or in desktop publishing software. Depending on your needs and the security options set in the individual PDF there are several ways to do this with the help of PDF Converter for Windows 7.

1.1 Features

Major Features include,

Easily extract images and/or text out of PDF files

Images and text can be extracted from virtually all PDF files while keeping the image layout and text formatting unchanged.

Convert PDF file into edit-ready document

Adobe PDF files can be converted into Microsoft Word document, Rich Text Format (RTF) Document, Plain Text file, Web pages with images(HTM, HTML), and pure images with layers.

Optimize images and output file size

Output image and text can be compressed and optimized for size.

Quickly regenerate a PDF file

Regenerate a PDF document by printing that document for your intended purpose.

Batch convert PDF files

PDF can be batch converted into other file types with the help of multi-threading conversion.

Adjust settings for image extraction

Raster images can be extracted to a specific height, width, color depth, and file format of your preferences.

Support high-resolution pictures and pre-press graphics

High-resolution pictures and press-ready graphics can be extracted from PDF document with color profile included..

Restore sensitive and hidden data

Restore sensitive metadata, hidden layers, and other secure information if any.

Process selected pages from PDF files

Specify the page range and skip list to convert the PDF pages of your choice. Convert odd or even pages with a click.

Decrypt encrypted PDF files before conversion

You can opt to unlock encrypted PDF files by password or skip the password to continue to the conversion process.

Output PDF file into 9 different formats

Convert PDF document to Plain Text File (TXT), Web pages with Images (HTM), Windows Bitmap (BMP), Portable Network Graphics (PNG), JPEG Format (JPG), GIF Format (GIF), Encapsulated PostScript (EPS), Windows Meta File (WMF), and Enhanced Meta File (EMF).

Define resolution of your preferences

You can define the resolution of the output images by Dot Per Inch (DPI), Zoom Level, or by height and width in pixel. Maximum DPI and Zoom Level supported in this version are 720 and 1000% separately.

Upgrade or Downgrade PDF files among all PDF versions

PDF files can be upgraded or downgraded among PDF version 1.0 (Adobe Acrobat 1.x), 1.1 (Adobe Acrobat 2.x), 1.2 (Adobe Acrobat 3.x), 1.3 (Adobe Acrobat 4.x), 1.4 (Adobe Acrobat 5.x), 1.5 (Adobe Acrobat 6.x), 1.6 (Adobe Acrobat 7.x), and 1.7 (Adobe Acrobat 8.x, 9.x, ISO 32000 Standard).

Batch conversion

You are free to use your own naming convention for the output file names while converting a folder or directory of PDF files into other file formats in batch.

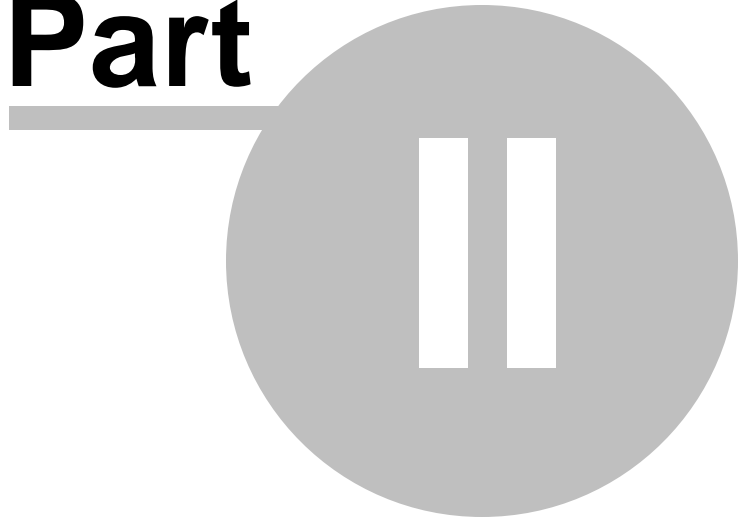

2 Conversion

You want to convert your Adobe PDF files easily to other formats, but you feel yourself not very experienced with computer? You are professional and you want to perform conversion from PDF to another with maximum speed and minimum of hard drive space required? PDF Converter for Windows 7 helps you to convert Adobe PDF files of all versions to other formats with all possible settings, using an easy step-by-step interface. Plain Text File (TXT), Windows Bitmap (BMP), Portable Network Graphics (PNG), JPEG Format (JPG), GIF Format (GIF), Encapsulated PostScript (EPS), Windows Meta File (WMF), and Enhanced Meta File (EMF) are supported with customized resolution creation. You can use Single mode for easy one-file conversion and Batch mode for fast converting of several files. All you need to do is simply reading explicative texts, making some clicks with your mouse's buttons and pressing "Next" button.

Extraction of text and graphics from PDF files with the aid of the PDF Converter for Windows 7 can be as easy as ABC. Just choose Web Pages with Images (.HTM) as the output option, and you will be able to turn text and graphics into web pages for further edits.

Conversion between different PDF versions is well supported, which means you can upgrade or downgrade any PDF file among PDF version 1.0 (Adobe Acrobat 1.x), 1.1 (Adobe Acrobat 2.x), 1.2 (Adobe Acrobat 3.x), 1.3 (Adobe Acrobat 4.x), 1.4 (Adobe Acrobat 5.x), 1.5 (Adobe Acrobat 6.x), 1.6 (Adobe Acrobat 7.x), and 1.7 (Adobe Acrobat 8.x, 9.x, ISO 32000 Standard).

2.1 Convert PDF to Images

Step by step wizard helps you convert PDF to a specific image format,

1. Start the PDF Converter for Windows 7 software.
2. Click Next button to proceed to the "Source PDF File" step.
3. Select a single file for single conversion or select a folder for batch conversion.
4. Click Next button to proceed to the "Conversion Options" step.
5. Specify the "Start page" and "End page". By default, the end page is 1, you can click the "Get Page Count" button to change it to the end page of your PDF file. For batch conversion, this button is not available, since the page count of a folder of PDF files differs. If you want to convert all pages in all PDF files, just enter 999999 (six nines), or just check the "Convert all pages" option.

Note: Once you check the "Convert all pages" option, any value input in "Start page" and "End page" columns will be totally ignored.

Tips: If you want to skip certain page or pages, just enter the page number or numbers in the "Skip Page" column. For example, you don't want to convert Page 2 and Page 13, just enter "2, 13" or "2 13" (without the double quotation marks) in the "Skip Page" column.

You can opt to convert only the odd pages or even pages by checking the appropriate options.

6. Click Next button to proceed to the "Security Options" step.

7. You can click the "Check Now" button to analyze the security status of your source PDF file or files. After checking, if at least one of your PDF files is encrypted, and you will be given three options. Choose the option matching your case.

Note: Providing the owner password (aka. master password) for encrypted PDF files, in most cases, helps produce better conversion results. If you don't know the password, just choose Skip.

8. Click Next button to proceed to the "Output Format" step.

9. Select the file type (aka. file format) for your output image files. Windows Bitmap (BMP), Portable Network Graphics (PNG), JPEG Format (JPG), GIF Format (GIF), Encapsulated PostScript (EPS), Windows Meta File (WMF), and Enhanced Meta File (EMF) are all for images.

10. Once you make your choice by clicking your mouse button, and you will be given the options for output resolution. DPI and Zoom Label are correlated. 72 DPI is for 100% Zooming, i.e. the original size.

Note: DPI is short for Dot Per Inch, which is a measuring unit for resolution. Zoom Level is a jargon to measure the scale of magnification or shrinking.

Tips: You can specify customized height and width for your output by choosing "Dimension in Pixel". Here the word Dimension is defined as Width x Height. If you wish to preserve the proportion of the original PDF pages, you should check either the "Based On Height" or "Based On Width" option to re-calculate the output size based on either height or width.

11. Click Next button to proceed to the "Output Location" step.

12. You need to specify the output file name for single file conversion; you need to specify the output path (aka. folder or directory or location) for batch conversion.

Note: A PDF file with more than one pages, when converted into image format, will be turned into multiple image files. For example, a 3-page PDF file comes with the filename "BusinessPlan.PDF" will be converted into three image files, BusinessPlan_p1.JPG, BusinessPlan_p2.JPG, and BusinessPlan_p3.JPG.

Tips: You can define the rule for file naming. The default file naming convention is %f_p%p, where %f stands for filename, in the example above, it is "BusinessPlan"; %p stands for page number, in the same example, it is 1, 2, and 3 separately. If you want to change the naming rule, just check the "Multiple pages naming convention" option, and make changes as you prefer.

13. Before clicking the Next button to proceed to the "Conversion In Progress" step, you can check the option "Suppress all pop up dialogs in the conversion". This will give you a smooth and silent conversion in the next step without any user interaction.

14. In the process of conversion, you can click Cancel button at any time to abort the conversion. When the process is completed, you will see the message reporting the status and result of the conversion. Click "Finish" button to close the program.

2.2 Convert PDF to Text

Step by step wizard helps you extract text from a PDF file,

1. Start the PDF Converter for Windows 7 software.
2. Click Next button to proceed to the "Source PDF File" step.
3. Select a single file for single conversion or select a folder for batch conversion.
4. Click Next button to proceed to the "Conversion Options" step.
5. Specify the "Start page" and "End page". By default, the end page is 1, you can click the "Get Page Count" button to change it to the end page of your PDF file. For batch conversion, this button is not available, since the page count of a folder of PDF files differs. 2.4 Downgrade or upgrade PDF version

3. Select a single file for single conversion or select a folder for batch conversion.
4. Click Next button to proceed to the "Conversion Options" step.

7. Select PDF as the output format.
8. You will see the version of your current PDF file. Choose the target PDF version from the drop list.
9. Click Next button to proceed to the "Output Location" step.
10. You need to specify the output file name for single file conversion; you need to specify the output path (aka. folder or directory or location) for batch conversion.
11. Before clicking the Next button to proceed to the "Conversion In Progress" step, you can check the option "Suppress all pop up dialogs in the conversion". This will give you a smooth and silent conversion in the next step without any user interaction.
12. In the process of conversion, you can click Cancel button at any time to abort the conversion. When the process is completed, you will see the message reporting the status and result of the conversion. Click "Finish" button to close the program.

3 Registration

Limitation in the Trial Version

The trial version is for evaluation purpose only, and it only converts **odd** pages in PDF files to image formats and plain text files. When requested to upgrade or downgrade a PDF document, the trial version only process 1-page PDF file.

To remove the above restrictions, users are required to purchase a license for the PDF Converter.

Registration

After you register, you get the full version product that convert all PDF pages in any PDF document. Here are all the benefits of registration,

- Better quality of document rendering

To register PDF Converter for Windows 7, you need to pay the registration fee.
